

Sensory Inclusion Service information for families re Support during Covid19 situation

General Notes

SIS hope that you are all well and following the national guidance. We are now at the end of the second full week of the `stay at home` situation as a result of the Covid -19 situation. A brief update from SIS as we enter the Easter break.

New referrals / Appointments

We have agreed with both ENT and Ophthalmology how new referrals will be processed and they have drawn up guidelines on how this will work. If you are in this situation then the relevant department will tell you how they are going to proceed. If a child is referred to SIS we will support you as best we can, given the current limitations we have around physical contact. The situation around other appointments and equipment is unchanged and was in the last update. If you have any particular issues regarding your child`s hearing or vision the first point of contact is your Teacher of the Deaf or QTVI who may be able to signpost you in terms of actions to take.

Contact with families

The team are continuing to make contact with all our carers of hearing aid wearers (that includes CI / Ponto/ BAHA) and teachers of the visually impaired are doing the same. I hope that by the end of this week we have made contact with the majority of you.

We have now agreed a more interactive way of keeping in touch with families after this break. This has been approved by the Service Delivery Manager for SEND and the Information Governance team. It`s vital for us that even during these exceptional circumstances we continue to protect your data in line within national guidelines. Individual support teachers may discuss this with you after the break

Easter Break

We are planning to work in terms of cover over the Easter Break as we have done in the past. The teaching staff are on leave as are others in the support team on occasions. Graham Groves will be on duty the first week and Theresa Robinson the second. Usually we give out the office number for **emergency** issues.
