Welcome to the Autumn 2020 SEND Parent/Carer Newsletter.

We would like to take the opportunity to share with you some updates and a review of what the Local Authority has been working on since the summer. In this newsletter you will find out about plans for a SEND Local Offer refresh, how we have continued to communicate with PODs (Parents Opening Doors) and IASS (Independent Advice and Support Service) and more about the exciting Voices Co-production project.

Over the next few months we will be working on lots of communication projects, for example looking at how we can share messages more effectively with parent/carers. As a council we are always striving to be open and honest and we want to ensure this is reflected in the way we communicate with you.

The first project is around how we deliver the parent/carer newsletter. Currently it's sent out and distributed by schools, PODs & IASS. However, we are looking at a new way of sending this out using a system where parents can sign up and receive a newsletter directly to their email inbox.

The second, is creating a new 'SEND News' page on the Local Offer. This page will share all the news and updates from SEND, including top tips relating to learning, good news stories and more. There will be a dedicated section for parent/carers.

And finally, we are in the process of setting up a closed Facebook Group: SEND Local Offer. When this group goes live it will be a place for us to share updates, consultation links and much more. This will be a fantastic opportunity to build a community around SEND, we will let you know when it goes 'Live'!

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Information & Guidance Updates

Updates have been made to the Guidance:

What parents and carers need to know about early years providers, schools and colleges during the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak

- assessments and exams.
- adding a 'national restrictions' section
- updating the relevant information about face coverings
- clinically extremely vulnerable children
- extra curricular activities.

SEND Newsflash: Minister Ford's letter to the SEND sector

Please download an open letter from Vicky Ford, the Parliamentary Under Secretary of State for Children and Families, to children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), their families and carers and those who work to support them.

Following the introduction of the new national restrictions on 5 November 2020, this letter provides advice and guidance on several issues, including school attendance, children who are clinically extremely vulnerable, remote education, face coverings in education settings, respite, health services for children and young people with SEND, and the new winter package to provide support for children and young people and their families.

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Free School Meals Eligibility

Over the last few months Free School Meals have featured in the media, in Telford & Wrekin Free School Meals (FSM) are available at schools maintained by the council for children whose parent(s) satisfy certain criteria in respect of their income or benefits.

Free School Meals - information flyer

Your child, or children may qualify for Free School Meals if you meet the following criteria:

 you or your partner have a child for whom you receive Child Benefit and who is attending a school or college in Telford and Wrekin

and you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income gross income of no more than £16,190)
- support under Part VI of the Immigration & Asylum Act 1999
- Pension Credit (guaranteed credit)
- Universal Credit and your household income is less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get).

Each school receives a weekly register showing the names of all children who are entitled to Free School Meals.

Should your circumstances change, for example you start work, increase your working hours to more than 16 a week, or cease being entitled to Income Support or Job Seeker's Allowance, you must notify us immediately.

Each school has the right to ask you to repay the value of any school meals that your child has been given for free, if they were not entitled to those meals.

If your child is eligible for Free School Meals, they'll remain eligible until they finish the current phase of schooling (primary or secondary) they're in on 31 March 2022.

These meetings are vital for the local authority to discuss service developments and talk about key themes that are being heard from parent/carers. Meeting 'Virtually' has been a great experience, it has enabled us to keep in contact and to continue to look at how we can co-produce services. We are keen to make sure that current information is shared and that we are able to update the Parent/Carer FAQ's regularly.

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



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Voices Project—Update An opportunity to share your story

In the last newsletter we were excited to announce the launch of a new co-production project Voices. Co-production in this case can be defined as: the Local Authority, Health and Education working with Parents/Carers and Young People to build policies and resilience in the services that are delivered.

This project is a collaboration between Local Authority SEND, Parent Carer Forum (PODs) and Health. It will invite young people, parents/carers, health, social care, education and schools to share their experiences, working together and looking at how the five principles of co-production can be further strengthened. Parents/Carers and young people will be encouraged to share their stories and experiences.

Voices is organised and facilitated by <u>Genuine Partnerships</u> which is supported by Rotherham County Council. Genuine Partnerships are a skilled and experienced team of parent carers, service practitioners and young people working with Contact.

So how is it going?

All six focus groups have now been held and we would like to thank everyone who has been involved. All the groups have been well attended by a whole range of professionals, partners, parent/carers and young people.

Next steps...

Following all the Focus Groups, all of the feedback, views and experiences will be collated by Genuine Partnerships into a report, each section will be shared with all the attendees of the focus groups so that they will have an opportunity to give their feedback and add any additional comments.

Once finalised the report will be published, this will be shared with everyone in Telford & Wrekin.

The report will then be followed up with an Action Planning event in the new year to look at the areas we can improve in coproduction and look how we can continue to move forward.
