Council apprentices land awards at celebration event



A trio who have excelled on apprenticeships with Telford & Wrekin Council have been recognised at a special awards ceremony.

Customer Service apprentice Fay Smith together with Health and Social Care apprentice Belinda Dunn were named 'Council apprentices of the year' while Business Administration apprentice Debbie Taylor won the 'Most Committed' award at the annual County Training awards evening.

The event, at the Gateway Education and Arts Centre in Shrewsbury, was a celebration of learners on apprenticeship programmes and those working towards standalone diploma programmes and also honoured employers who have supported County Training apprentices.

Over 90 people attended the celebration event and award categories included Apprentice of the Year, Telford & Wrekin Council Apprentice of the Year, Shropshire Council Apprentice of the Year, Most Committed Award, Rising Star award and Continuing Professional Development award.

Fay has consistently shown commitment to her apprenticeship throughout her journey and has always had a really positive attitude towards the apprenticeship work and her job with the Council.

She had to move to a different Leisure Centre in the borough towards the end of her apprenticeship as the one she was based at was undergoing a re-vamp, but it didn't phase her, and she adapted well to her new work environment.

Meanwhile Belinda has shown great commitment to learning and developing throughout her apprenticeship, has grown in confidence and improved her leadership skills and qualities.

Despite facing some challenges in her role, she rose to the challenges and had the opportunity to implement changes in her workplace.

Debbie Taylor won the most committed award after showing a high level of commitment throughout her apprenticeship.

She had two promotions at work in close succession and is reliable, a great communicator and is always upbeat and had grown in confidence along the way.

Winners each received a certificate and glass award engraved with the Herefordshire, Ludlow, and North Shropshire College logo.

A wide range of employers attended the event including Lanyon Bowdler and the Greenhous Group and three guest speakers shared their experiences as an apprentice or an employer during the evening.

They included Michelle Harrington from Empower Trust who gave an insight into the employer's role in apprenticeships, Kelly Jones who is completing her level 2 in health and social care with Hendra House and Chris Hirons from Shropshire Council who spoke about not only being an apprentice but also being an employer supporting other staff in apprenticeships.

## **Temporary Pop Up Swimming Pools**

Schools considering the use of Temporary Pop-Up Swimming pools are urged to verify that the operators have carefully reviewed and implemented the new guidance.

Following an update from Swim England in December 2024

Briefing note on use of temporary 'pop-up' swimming pools is published

a checklist has been devised to help support schools adhere to the new guidance and the ability to fulfil the relevant requirements.

Schools are reminded that the operator and school cannot limit their liability, and all parties must ensure due diligence has been completed.

It is highly recommended that when considering a pop-up pool that schools either contact the Education and Skills

### **ELSEC**



## Are you interested in being part of the ELSEC project in September 2025?

ELSEC (Early language for every child)

ELSEC is a 2 year pilot project, commissioned by the DfE, as part of the SEND and AP Change Programme. This year 8 primary schools and 6

private, voluntary or independent nursery settings in Shropshire are involved in ELSEC. We have noticed that Shropshire aligns with national findings, with around two thirds of 3 – 6 year-olds having some difficulties with their speech, language and communication. The ELSEC team has worked with current settings to reduce the communication gap by up to 75%, meaning that more children are able to access a full curriculum offer, are more confident socially and have enhanced life chances in the future.

From September 2025 we will be looking to work with a new set of schools and nurseries to expand the skillset, in Shropshire, for SLCN. As an ELSEC team we can offer:

- A dedicated member of the ELSEC team to work, in setting, with you on a weekly basis.
- Regular support from a speech therapist / specialist teacher
- Working with whole cohorts
- Modelling, coaching and support to deliver quality interventions including Talk Boost, BEST (Building Expressive Sentence Therapy)
- Communication friendly audits
- Parent workshops
- Whole school CPD

#### In return we ask for:

- Staff that are excited to work with us on the project
- Named staff in each setting as a first point of contact
- A guiet space to run interventions and parent workshops
- A warm welcome to your setting
