

Useful tips



Musical Interaction Songs

- The songs can be used as part of a small circle time or with individual children.
- Use a quiet room with less distractions and have chairs for the children to sit on.
- One adult to lead the circle time and one adult to encourage the children to focus and sit on the chairs.
- Increase the number of songs when the children have increased the time they can stay focussed.
- Adults to show enjoyment and give lots of praise when there is a response from the children.
- Songs will need props, and these can be collated together in a bag, box, or basket.

Songs

Hello, Hello:

Props: children to play an instrument while singing.

Silly Sound - Tune, 'Michael Finnegan'.

Shall we make a very silly sound? Shall we make a very silly sound? Can you make a very silly sound? (Give an item to a child).

.... Makes a very silly sound.



Repeat for each child.

Props: items which make a silly noise, horn, squeaker, bird whistle, whoopee cushion.

Time to Have Some Fun Today – Tune: 'Pop goes the weasel.'

Time to have some fun today.

Time for smiles and laughter

Time to have surprises too.

Uh oh(pause for a reaction)

I've got you (cloth over pupil) [name of child].

Repeat for each child.

Windy song:

Windy, windy, windy, Who likes it windy? Windy, windy, windy, likes it windy.



Props: cloth

It's windy, it's windy, its very very windy (more/finished).

Repeat for each child. Props: hand fan.

Repeat with new actions, picking up on natural actions of the children (clap, stamp, nod).

Blowing Bubbles – Tune, 'Tommy Thumb'.

Repeat for each child. Props: pot of bubbles



Squeezy Ball - Tune, 'Skip-to-ma-loo.'

Squee...ee...ezy ball, Does it roll along the floor, Pick it up and squeeze it tight, Squee...ee...ezy ball.



Props: selection of different balls.

Parental Section:

- All the above activities can be carried out at home.
- Use a quiet environment and turn off all background noises (television/radio).
- Arrange a time during the day so parent/s can follow child's interest, join in their play, and use songs to which are motivating to child and link to play activities.
