





Sensory Audit

What is a Sensory Audit?

A <u>sensory audit</u> is an environmental audit which can be used to assess factors which may impact a child's behaviour. It can be used to create an environment which enables the inclusion of a child with sensory needs, by making simple adjustments.

Consider:

- Visual impact e.g. lighting, wall displays, layout, and organisation of resources...
- Sound e.g. acoustics, background noise, use of music...
- Smells e.g. paint, glue, perfumes, cooking smells...
- Touch and feel e.g. clothing, seating...

Refer to individual children's sensory profiles when making adjustments to the environment.
